- **June 22-26 camps:** Design studio, graphic design studio, sketching and visual communication
- **July 6-10 camps:** architecture and interior design, biomedical engineering, biotechnology, civil engineering, mobile app design, product design and innovation
- **July 13-17 camps:** architectural engineering, architecture and design, automotive engineering, cybersecurity, electrical and computer engineering, game art, nanotechnology, robotics I, transportation design
- **July 20-24 camps:** architecture and design, game art, robotics II, science fiction
